ETF shares are listed on an exchange, and shares are generally purchased and sold in the secondary market at market price. At times, the market price may be at a premium or discount to the ETF's per share NAV. In addition, ETFs are subject to the risk that an active trading market for an ETF's shares may not develop or be maintained. Buying or selling ETF shares on an exchange may require the payment of brokerage commissions.

Market Price is the most recent NYSE Arca Official Closing Price. Weighted Average Maturity is a measure of the average maturity of all of the underlying security instruments in the fund, weighted to reflect the relative percentage ownership of each instrument, and taking into account applicable "maturity shortening" provisions. Weighted Average Life Maturity is the Weighted Average Maturity of the fund calculated without reference to the "maturity shortening" provisions. Premium/Discount Shareholders may pay more than net asset value when they buy Fund shares and receive less than net asset value when they sell those shares, because shares are bought and sold at current market prices. 20-Day Average Volume is the sum of last 20 days of trading volume divided by 20 days. 30-Day Median Bid-Ask Spread gives investors the midpoint within the spread between an ETF's selling price and buying price. It is calculated over the last 30 days in 10 second intervals by dividing the difference between the bid (sell price) and offer (buy price) by the midpoint of the National Best Bid Offer (NBBO) and identifying the median of those values. Tracking error is a measure of the unexplained portion of a portfolio's performance relative to a benchmark. It's essentially the standard deviation of the difference between the portfolio's returns and the selected benchmark's returns. A low tracking error indicates that a fund tracks the benchmark closely or, in other words, has approximately the same returns as the benchmark. SEC 30-day yield is based upon dividends per share from net investment income during the past 30 days, divided by the period ended maximum offering price per share and annualized.

BNY Mellon Securities Corporation ("BNYSC"), a subsidiary of the BNY, serves as distributor of the fund. BNYSC does not distribute fund shares in less than Creation Units, nor does it maintain a secondary market in fund shares. BNYSC may enter into selected dealer agreements with Authorized Participants for the sale of Creation Units of fund shares.

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The investment adviser for the fund is BNY Mellon ETF Investment Adviser, LLC (BNYETF). BNYETF has engaged its affiliate, Dreyfus, to serve as the fund's sub-adviser. All are subsidiaries of BNY. BNY is the corporate brand of The Bank of New York Mellon Corporation.

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
